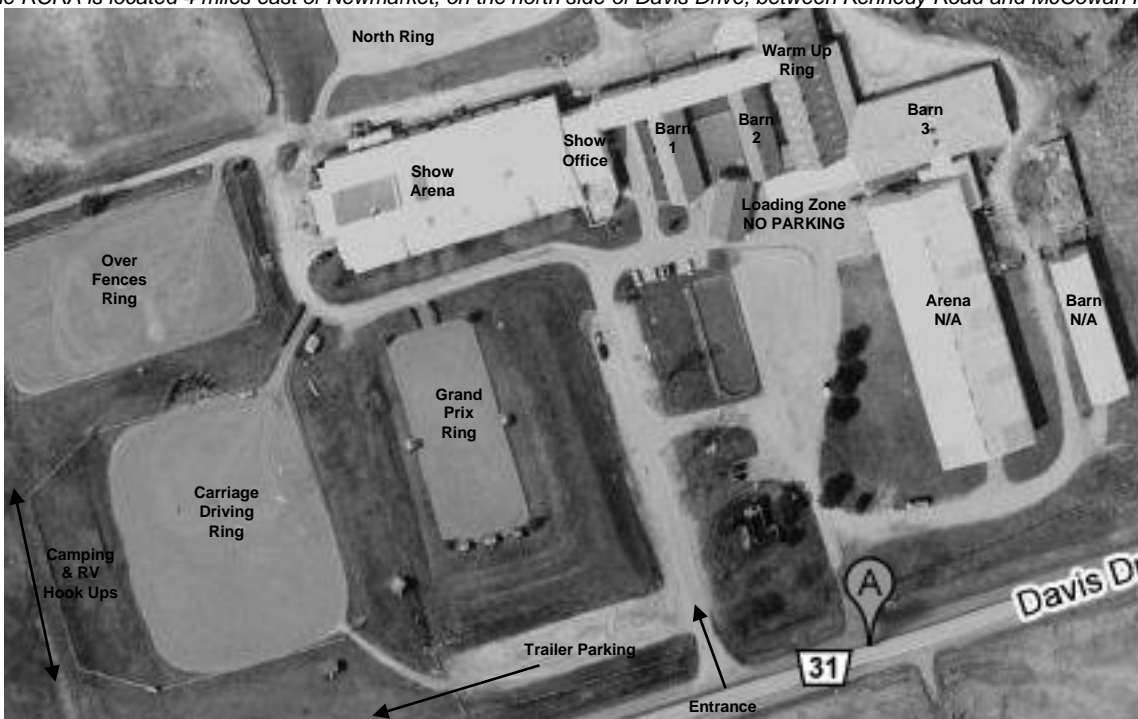

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Equine Canada (EC), the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

E.C. is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions;
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please read the following carefully

1. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

1.1 E.C. Rules - Every entry at a recognized show shall constitute an agreement that the person making it, owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider and the horse shall be subject to the constitution and the rules of the Federation, the local rules of the show, and that every horse, rider and/or driver is eligible as entered and that the owner and any of his or her representatives are bound by the constitution and rules of Equine Canada and the Show accepts as final the decision of the hearing committee on any question arising under said rules and agree to hold the Show, E.C., their Officials, Directors and Employees harmless for any action taken.

1.2 Insurance - EACH OWNER, LESSEE AND EXIBITOR MUST PROVIDE PROOF OF CURRENT PROVINCIAL SPORT ORGANIZATION MEMBERSHIP (OEF/FEQ), which provides the required liability coverage. This is the only approved insurance accepted by EC Sanctioned competitions and is enforced by EC. (Refer to article A203 of E.C. General Regulations)

1.3 Helmets - All persons riding over fences anywhere on the competition grounds must wear protective headgear secured with a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet. Harnesses must be secured and properly fitted. It is recommended that the protective headgear meet the ASTM standard and display the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal. Article A1308.3

1.4 Coggins Test - A negative 2009 Coggins test must be presented for each and every horse brought on the premise of the RCRA. No number will be issued until proof of the test is shown. A photocopy of your horse's Coggins test is required with the submission of your entry form.

1.5 Drug Fees - A drug fee of \$5.00 per horse entered will be collected along with regular entry fees. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing.

1.6 Office/Medic Fee - An Office/Medic Fee of \$20.00 per horse will be collected along with regular entry fees.

1.7 Entry Deadline - Entries must be SIGNED and sent to the show secretary on or before **June 24, 2009**. Entries post marked after midnight June 24, 2009 will be considered late entries. The addition or change of a horse on an entry after June 24, 2009 is considered a late entry and will be charged as such. All entries sent by mail or otherwise must be accompanied with payment in the correct amount for entry fees and other required fees or they will not be accepted. *Cheques post dated after June 24, 2009 will be considered a late entry.*

1.8 Registration - Horses shown that are owned by a Canadian Resident for longer than 12 months must be pure bred or part bred and registered with the Canadian Morgan Horse Association, under the Canadian Livestock Records Corp. (or if under one year of age, be eligible for registration). Horses must be entered under their full registered name and in the name of their registered owner(s) or lessee(s). Foreign owned horses must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association or the British Morgan Horse Society. A photocopy of registration papers (showing name, number and owner(s)) is required to be sent along with each entry.

NO NUMBERS WILL BE ISSUED UNTIL PROOF OF REGISTRATION IS SHOWN.

1.9 EC Sport License (formerly membership) - Exhibitors and equitation riders must comply with EC rules regarding Sport Licenses. All competitors, owners, riders, trainers, lessees and agents must be current EC Sport License holders. All exhibitors (riders and owners) must provide proof of liability insurance by means of their PSO memberships. Non EC Sport Licence holders will be required to purchase a Temporary Sport License. Amateurs must hold an Amateur card. A Temporary Sport license holder may compete in amateur classes provided an Amateur Affidavit has been completed and is on file with the competition Secretary. Single Event Upgrade available for exhibitors with Bronze License. Owners and competitors residing in the U.S.A. must be members of USEF.

Photocopies of both 2009 EC sport license and PSO memberships must accompany entry forms, or be presented to the Show Secretary, at the show, before numbers are issued.

1.10 Entry Fees - Fees are as follows:

1.11 Additional Class Entries – Entries must be submitted at least two classes ahead the class being joined (except for In Hand Championships) or the entry will not be accepted. Class entry fees apply, as outlined above.

1.12 Identification - In all classes, except Equitation and Performance Championships, the name of the animal being exhibited must be given at the time of entry. In Performance Championship classes an entry will be accepted but must be named at least two classes before the class commences.

1.13 Assigned Entry Numbers - Numbers must be worn at all times on the competition grounds.

1.14 Hors Concours - Competitors will be accepted at the discretion of the organizing committee, if space is available. Article A808

1.15 Soundness - Entries must be serviceably sound and in good condition.

1.16 Refunds - No entry or stall fee will be refunded after the official start of the show for any reason. Before the official start of the show, entry fees will be refunded with the submission of a certified veterinary certificate. For exhibitors from a distance, a veterinary certificate will be accepted if sent to the Secretary postmarked by July 15, 2009. (The Show Secretary would also appreciate a phone call if your horse(s) is/are unable to compete). Stall fees will not be refunded.

A horse which is deemed unfit for any class as per veterinary certificate will be deemed unfit for ALL classes in the show.

2. STABLING/GROUNDS

2.1 Non Stabling Fee - A Non Stabling Fee of \$20.00 per horse per day shown will be collected along with regular entry fees for horses not being stabled on the grounds.

2.2 Allocation of Stalls - Allocation of stalls will be on a first come, first served basis (assuming that full stall fees are received with entry). Entrants requesting to be stabled together or share tack stalls MUST indicate this on their entry forms.

2.3 Stalls & Bedding - Only box stalls are available. Horse stalls and Tack stalls are \$85.00. Note that the initial bedding WILL NOT BE SUPPLIED. Shavings will be available for purchase during the show from the Show Secretary. To assist with our planning, we ask that you order and pay for shavings with your entry form. Once delivered to stalls, Royal Canadian Riding Academy is not responsible for any shavings that are removed.

2.4 Use of Stalls - Exhibitors are forbidden to set up in any stall which does not have their name or the name of their horse(s) posted by the show on the stall door without special permission from the Show Chairperson(s) or person designated by him or her. Use of nails, screws, or fixtures, on any stall, is prohibited.

NOTE: EXHIBITORS WILL AUTOMATICALLY BE CHARGED \$85.00 PER STALL FOR USING ANY STALL(S) NOT ASSIGNED TO THEM.

2.5 Late Arrivals - Stable accommodation cannot be guaranteed after the start of the show unless the Show Chairperson(s) is/are notified of the possibility of late arrival.

2.6 Trailers - No overnight stabling of horses in trailers will be allowed.

2.7 Hours - Barns will be open at 12:00 p.m. on Friday July 10th, and horses must depart by 12:00 p.m. on Monday July 13th.

2.8 Dogs - All dogs must be kept on a leash and all owners must abide by the "Poop & Scoop" By-Law. **NO DOGS** allowed in arena/barn area.

2.9 Bathing Horses - Horses must be bathed in horse wash rack areas only. These areas are for washing horses only.

2.10 Parking - Vehicles must be parked in designated areas only

2.11 All motorized vehicles including golf carts, scooters, dirt bikes, 4-wheelers, etc. may be operated by licensed drivers only.

3. ACCOMMODATIONS

3.1 Campers - There are camper hook-ups available at a cost of \$85.00 each. The hook-ups include water and electricity. A \$40.00 fee will be charged for overnight accommodations in tents or campers and trailers that are not hooked-up. Please indicate the number required on your entry form and include the charge in your total fees.

NOTE: EXHIBITORS WHO PLUG IN CAMPERS OR TRAILERS OF ANY TYPE WILL AUTOMATICALLY BE CHARGED AN \$85.00 HOOK UP FEE. THIS INCLUDES EXTENSION CORDS TO THE STABLING AREA. PROOF OF PAYMENT MUST BE DISPLAYED IN WINDOW OF CAMPER OR TRAILER.

3.2 Property/Accident - The Sponsors of the Ontario Morgan Horse Championship Classic and Royal Canadian Riding Academy will not be responsible for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost, stolen or destroyed; and will not be responsible or liable for injury sustained in any way to exhibitors, employees, spectators, or any other interested parties. It is a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show and its management blameless for any loss or accident to his or her horse(s) or equipment that may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

4. SHOWING REQUIREMENTS

4.1 Prizes - Ribbons will be awarded in each class, as designated.

4.2 Format - The show committee reserves the right to add, combine, cancel or split classes.

4.3 Disqualification - The Judge has the power to rule out any horse which he or she considers does not belong in the class(es) in which it is entered.

4.4 Protest - Any exhibitor desiring to protest is obliged to file his/her protest in writing to the Horse Show Committee and comply with the provisions of protest as laid out in the most current issue of the E. C. rule book.

4.5 Appliances - All appliances or devices, e.g. chains, rattles, aerosol sprays, etc. will be prohibited from the show ring and any area adjacent to it during the performance of a class. The use of rubber or elastic exercising devices on the legs before or during the show is prohibited on the show grounds. Violators will be barred from further participation in the show and will forfeit all entry fees and winnings for the entire show.

4.6 Ring Procedure - If there is a "HOLD" requested, there will be three minutes given from the time the last horse leaves the ring from the previous class. A "HOLD" must be requested at least two classes before the class affected. Requests for tack holds must be made to and approved by the "in" gate official.

CLASS LIST

IN HAND

Entries are to be judged individually, standing and then at a walk and trot on the line and must be serviceably sound. Horses must stand squarely on all four feet with front legs perpendicular to the ground. Rear legs may be placed slightly back. Emphasis shall be on type and conformation, with consideration given to horse's ability to move correctly on the lead. Two handlers allowed. No whip over six feet long, including snapper or lash is allowed.

SPECIALTY IN HAND

Classic Pleasure, Hunter, or Western to be shown with tack and attire traditional to the section represented. The handler should dress in proper show ring attire. Classic Pleasure may have one or two *AMATEUR* handlers. To be judged in accordance with the Open In Hand judging standard. There is only one standard type and conformation of the Morgan Horse.

ONTARIO MORGAN BREEDER'S FUTURITY

Horses are to be properly entered in the Ontario Morgan Breeder's Futurity and remain eligible under the OMBF rules. Handlers must be in suitable attire; dress pants, shirt & tie, no running shoes.

To be judged on performance with apparent ability to give a good pleasure ride, with emphasis on manners and gait 60%; type and conformation 40%. Horses NOT to be tested on obstacles. Appointments according to Section B, Article B5602 of the E.C. Rule Book. Saddle Seat attire only.

To be judged on performance and apparent ability to give a good pleasure drive, with emphasis on manners and gait 60%; type and conformation 40%.

Horses must have been entered, shown and judged in Class 27, 35, 39, 56, 73 or 75. First three placings of Classes 35, 39 and 73 must compete or forfeit prizes for those classes. First three placings in Class 27, 56 and 75 may compete. Specifications as for Pleasure Driving Division except percentages will be 50% - 50%.

CLASSIC ENGLISH PLEASURE DIVISION

EC OR USEF AMATEUR CARD REQUIRED

Open to stallions, mares and geldings. To be shown at a walk, pleasure trot, road trot and canter with a light rein, but still maintaining contact with the horse's mouth. Entries to be judged on manners, performance and gait 60%; type and conformation 40%. It is imperative that the horse give the distinct appearance of being a

pleasure to ride, with emphasis on the walk and smooth transitions. Horses must stand quietly and back readily. Length of toe must not exceed 4-1/2", shoes not to exceed 16oz. Cross entering into English Pleasure is allowed. Horses NOT to be tested on obstacles. Appointments according to Section B, Article B5702 of the E.C. Rule Book. Saddle seat attire only.

34 Classic English Pleasure

Entry Fee: \$20.00 Ribbons to 6th place

82 Classic English Pleasure Championship

Horses entered must have been entered, shown and judged in Class 34. First three placings of this class must compete or forfeit prizes for this class. Specification as for Classic English Pleasure Division except percentages will be 50% - 50%. Horses may be stripped.

CLASSIC PLEASURE DRIVING DIVISION

EC OR USEF AMATEUR CARD REQUIRED

Horses to be shown to an appropriate two wheeled vehicle. One attendant without whip must head each horse in Classic Pleasure Driving classes. Open to stallions, mares and geldings. To be shown at a walk, pleasure trot and road trot. Entries to be judged on manners, performance and gait 60%; type and conformation 40%. It is imperative that the horse give the distinct appearance of being a pleasure to drive, with emphasis on the walk and smooth transitions. Horses must stand quietly and back readily. Length of toe must not exceed 4-1/2", shoes not to exceed 16oz. Cross entering into Pleasure Driving is allowed.

18 Classic Pleasure Driving

Entry Fee: \$20.00 Ribbons to 6th place

63 Classic Pleasure Driving Championship

Horses entered must have been entered, shown and judged in Class 18. First three placings of this class must compete or forfeit prizes for this class. Specification as for Classic Pleasure Driving Division except percentages will be 50% - 50%.

WESTERN PLEASURE DIVISION

Open to stallions, mares and geldings. To be shown at a walk, jog and lope with light rein but still maintaining contact with the horse's mouth. Horses must back readily. To be judged on manners and gait 60%; type and conformation 40%. Horses NOT to be tested on obstacles.

22 Western Pleasure - Junior Exhibitor

Horses to be ridden by a youth 17 years of age and under as of December 1, 2008. NO STALLIONS ALLOWED.

Horses entered must have been entered, shown and judged in Class 20, 22, 29, 32, 58 or 81. First three placings of Class 29 and 58 must compete or forfeit prizes for those classes, except if a rider has qualified more than one horse, he/she may choose which horse will be shown back. First three placings of Class 20, 22, 32 & 81 may compete. Specifications as for Western Pleasure Division except percentages will be 50% - 50%. Horses to be stripped.

Horses must have been entered, shown and judged in class 31. First three placings of class 31 must compete or forfeit prizes. Specifications as for Hunter Pleasure Division except percentages will be 50% - 50%. Horses may be stripped.

No Entry Fee Trophy and ribbons to 6th place

90 Hunter Pleasure Championship
Horses must have been entered, shown and judged in Class 19, 20, 26, 31, 36, 42, 64, or 76. First three placings of Class 19, 26, 42, and 64 must compete or forfeit prizes for those classes, except if a rider has qualified more than one horse, he/she may choose which horse will be shown back. First three placings of Class 20, 31, 36, and 76 may compete. Specifications as for Hunter Pleasure Division except percentages will be 50% - 50%. Horses will be stripped.

No Entry Fee Cooler and ribbons to 8th place

CARRIAGE DRIVING DIVISION

Appointments: Regular two and four wire wheeled show buggies used in Park and Pleasure Classes are not allowed. Whips and their passengers should be dressed conservatively according to the current style. For whips of either sex, an apron or knee rug, gloves and hat are mandatory. Ladies may wear pant suits but should avoid hats which may obstruct vision. A whip must be carried. In any of these classes horses may be driven as a team. See the E.C. rule book, Section C for further information on Carriage Driving. Open to Morgans & Registered Part Morgans.

Entry Fee: \$20.00 Ribbons to 6th place

15 Carriage Driving - Pleasure Turnout
A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. Entrants are to be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, collected trot, working trot and trot on. To stand quietly and to rein back. All entries chosen for a workout are to be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute a figure of eight. To be judged 40% on performance, manners and way of going; 30% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle; 15% on neatness and appropriateness of attire and 15% on overall impression.

16 Carriage Driving - Reinsmanship
A pleasure driving class in which the entries are judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, collected trot, working trot and trot on. To stand quietly both on the rail and while lined up and rein back. Drivers shall be required to rein back. All entries chosen for a work-off to be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the Judge and may be asked to execute a figure of eight or any other appropriate task. To be judged on handling of reins and whip, control, posture and overall appearance of the driver 75%; condition of harness and vehicle plus neatness of attire 25%.

37 Carriage Driving - Pick Your Own Route
To be driven over a course of obstacles (paired markers) with no set route. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles. Typically obstacles of this type of class are not measured for each entry, but are set at 2.5 meters or 8'3" at the start of the competition, and only reset in the event of a knockdown. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle to the designated finish line, choosing his/her own route. Each obstacle is to be negotiated once and only once, but may be approached from either direction. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off.

38 Carriage Driving - Timed Obstacle
To be driven at a trot and timed over a course of numbered obstacles. The winner will be determined by the best time. If a tie occurs in time for first place, the winner will be decided by a drive-off. Penalties to be assessed as per EC Rules, Section C.

40 Carriage Driving - Working
A pleasure driving class in which the entries are judged primarily on the suitability of a horse to provide a pleasant drive. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly both on the rail and while lined up and rein back. All entries chosen for a work-off may be worked both ways of the ring at any gait requested by the Judge and may be asked to execute a figure of eight. To be judged on performance, manners and way of going 70%; on condition and fit of harness and vehicle 20%; and on neatness of attire 10%.

♦♦ **CHAMPION CARRIAGE DRIVING PRESENTATION**
To be awarded Saturday afternoon to the Morgan Horse which has accumulated the most points in this division. Points will be scored using the point schedule on the last page.

WORKING HUNTER DIVISION

Open to Morgans & Registered Part Morgans

69 High Low Working Hunter Over Fences - 2'3"-2'6"

Entries will be judged both ways of the ring at a walk, pleasure trot, road trot and canter, on rider's seat, hands, general management and control of the horse. The judge will ask for a test. Test to be selected from the CMHA Medal Class Rules.

67 Stick Horse Class
Open to exhibitors 8 years of age and under as of December 1, 2008. Exhibitors must provide their own stick horse, show attire is optional. Entries are to be judged at a walk, trot and canter, may be asked to back up. **EC sport license not required.**

68 Lead Line
Rider to be 8 years old and under as of December 1, 2008. Horse to be led by an adult on foot. Performance of child and suitability of mount to be judged. Children entering this class may not enter any other class at the show. Appointments should be similar to all other equitation classes as this is not a costume class. It is strongly recommended that securely attached helmets be worn in this class. Open to Morgans & Registered Part-Morgans. **EC sport license not required.**

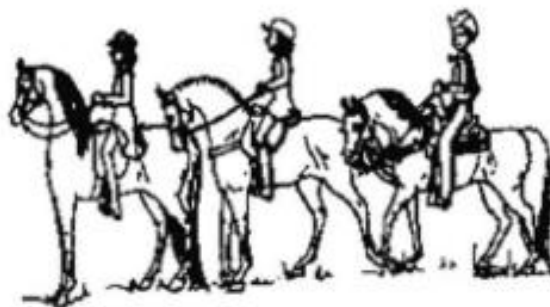
